North Fulton Community Charities (NFCC) serves over 5,000 families with basic needs, such as food, rent, utilities, clothing, and adult education classes. This number is constantly growing as more families are pushed to the brink of poverty. NFCC walks alongside families in need and provides food and staple goods. The supply of diapers and baby wipes runs low and needs to be continually replenished. Your small group can support NFCC by replenishing its diaper and wipe supply.

## INSTRUCTIONS

---

**STEP 1:** As a group, spend some time learning about North Fulton Community Charities and the families they serve. Their website ([www.nfcchelp.org](http://www.nfcchelp.org)) is a good place to start.

**STEP 2:** Review the needed items below.

**STEP 3:** Discuss as a group how you will collect the items you'll donate. Feel free to invite others (neighbors and co-workers) to donate as well. You may want to set a goal for how many items your group will collect.

**STEP 4:** Gather your donated items and meet as a group to spend some time praying for the families that will receive the items.

**STEP 5:** Donations can be dropped off Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

### NOTES

**Needed Items:** diapers (size 4 to 6), pull-ups (all sizes), wipes.

**Instructions:** Pull-ups and diapers need to be placed in bundles of 8. Bundles should be rubber-banded together with a Post-it note indicating the size. Extras may be rubber-banded and labeled by size, then put in a separate bag labeled, "Extras."
